If you love me, rejoice because I am going to the Father'. Alleluia.

what is performed at the right hand of God, is also represented, upon this holy table.

All May we who share this broken bread, be united with Christ and one another.

The priest says the invitation to communion

I heard the voice of a great multitude crying, Alleluia.

The Lord our God has entered into his kingdom.

All Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb. Alleluia.

The Agnus Dei *is said.*

All Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us.

The Priest and people now receive holy communion.

Prayer after Communion *Silence is kept.*

we may set our hearts in the heavenly places; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
