

From Father Robert Dear Friends

I am not sure what the ecclesiastical equivalent of a 'Dear John' letter is, but this is a humble attempt at one.

When Sir Humphrey Appleby left the fictitious Department of Administrative Affairs he said to gathered colleagues, "an occasion like this engenders within one a certain emotional ambiguity and personal ambivalence. For while one is honoured by the cause of it, one is saddened by the fact of it...", and so continues his glacial farewell speech. Finding the right words to describe this feeling is, almost inevitably, an exercise in understatement, especially when it is moving away from a place and people whom you love.

When Bishop Pete contacted me all those weeks ago, and I prayed and meditated on it, I felt rather like Old Testament characters such as Moses, Isaiah, Jonah etc who basically said, "here I am Lord, send someone else". However, as the baptised, whether ordained or not, our life is one of discipleship, which means walking in the way of the cross.

It is this sometimes painful and uncertain path, which ultimately leads to new life.

That is the hope we carry with us as we begin our farewells and moments marked with the phrase, "that will be our last..."

As a family we have been wonderfully happy here, and deeply grateful for the support and friendship particularly in recent months. Our love for you will be an enduring memory.

Can I ask that you pray for us, as surely as we will be praying for you as you enter your interregnum. Interregnums are obviously worrying because they feel uncertain. However, St Thomas' is a wonderful place and has much to offer and receive from a new priest.

Therefore, just a few words of caution.

The path through the interregnum is led by the Archdeacon, and assisted by the Area Dean and others who will help you plan for your future. The system is deliberately managed by the Archdeacon to ensure that the parish shows itself in the best and most honest light. This will begin once I leave, so can I encourage you to let the system do what it is designed to do, and resist the temptation of 'getting ahead in the game'. This will not only help the process run more smoothly, but will also reduce the stress of the wardens and lay chair. Fade, Steve and Annabel will have much to navigate

and this will not be aided by lots of individuals lobbying them. I appreciate how hard it is, because it is a place you care about, but remember those charged with managing this process for the parish are also, largely, embarking on the unknown too. The PCC understand St Thomas' well, and so too do the Diocese and Area, so time spent in prayer will at this stage be the best way forward.

Over the next few weeks I will be wearing out my knees in love, and thanks.

Continue to shine as a light in this area, and then, as Mother Julian of Norwich says in her *Revelations of Divine Love*, "all will be well, all manner of things will be well."

Despite the recent sad passing of her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, we are still keen to plant a small apple tree in the Church garden as part of the Queen's Green Canopy (QGC).



The Queen's Green Canopy is a unique, UKwide tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022, by inviting people to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee." Everyone from individuals to Scout and Girlguiding groups, villages, cities, counties, schools and corporates were encouraged to plant trees from October 2021 when the tree planting season begins, through to the end of

Goings-on at the PCC

The most recent meeting of the PCC was on 27th September. Here is a summary of the main

business that was discussed.

Finances

Caroline, our Treasurer, updated us on the finances. Overall income is a bit better than expected, and more than covers a slight increase in budgeted expenditure. Congregational giving is on target for the year; the Church Hall is doing well — strongly recovering after the past two years; rental income from the church tower telecoms equipment is slightly more than expected.

Buildings Update

A new noticeboard outside the Hall is being planned. The Committee looked at design drawings and agreed a suitable size for the board, from the options on offer.

Fr Robert reported that there are three sections of plasterwork within the church building that have worked loose and are at risk of falling away from the interior walls. A specialist survey has detected that the plaster contains asbestos, but its nature is such as to be very low risk to health when disturbed. Therefore, the building will not need to be closed whilst repairs are made. Scaffolding will be required, and at the same time we aim to inspect and assess the copper roof on the south side, lower level, which may require attention.

The Committee agreed to investigate the setting up of a contract for regular cleaning of rainwater gutters and downpipes. This should largely prevent future problems with the interior plasterwork and woodwork.

Annual Pantomime

You may remember that the pantomime planned for January 2022 had to be cancelled because of concerns about transmission of the Covid virus. Cancellation happened after a great deal of planning and rehearsing had already taken place. Sue Cunningham reported to the Committee that it had been decided, very reluctantly, not to go ahead with a Pantomime in early 2023. It had been hoped that the 2022 production could be brought back to life for January 2023. However, this has not proved to be possible due to non-availability of several previous cast members, difficulty in involving new people (adults and children), and excessive workload on key members of the production team.
