

From our Vicar

Dear Friends

Can I firstly wish you a very happy New Year!

This year promises to be an exciting year as we find different ways to celebrate the 80th birthday of the building.

Of course, it is not the church that is eighty years old as the Body of Christ in this corner of Hanwell. The life of the church began, appropriately, in an upper room on Elthorne Avenue. As we sit in one of the finest twentieth century churches these humble beginnings serve as a powerful reminder of the way in which the Lord works.

In St John's gospel one of the accounts of the feeding of the 5000 features a cameo from St Andrew. In this account, when Jesus asks for what the disciples have, St Phillip sarcastically replies, "Six months' wages would not buy enough bread for each of them!" St Andrew rather tentatively clocks a child's packed lunch as a start. Jesus takes the packed lunch and feeds 5000 people. The crowd, church history, and biblical scholarship then spend the future reflecting on the miracle, and forget the child's offering, and Andrew's nervous faith.

I doubt that the first eucharistic community in Elthorne Avenue could have imagined Maufe, Gill et.al. building them a new spiritual home, but they could get on with the work of mission in the present.

Our 80th is a chance to remember the faithfulness of forebears in Hanwell, and the courage of the people of St Thomas' Portman Square who sacrificed their spiritual home so that the mission of God could continue in another corner of his vineyard they knew nothing about. It is also a chance for us to joyfully celebrate the opportunity of being a part of that story of faith in Hanwell.

My hope and prayer is that we will together make the most of what this year brings, so that we and the community we serve are renewed. Whatever your gifts, and they may feel packed-lunch size, do take the chance to use them this year. Also, remember the parish, the wider Church and the world in your prayers. Your friend and priest



St Thomas's 80th Anniversary Prayer Book

As we all know St Thomas' Church is celebrating its 80th anniversary. Our church community started in an upper room, moved to a tin tabernacle and then moved into our amazing church. Throughout this time we have been praying; praying for our world, for the Church, for those who govern us, for those in our community, for those we have lost and those suffering illness or loneliness and for ourselves.

We all have those prayers that speak to us, that contain the words that seem to encapsulate perfectly what it is we wish to say to our Lord. These may be our own words or they may be those written by those who came before us. They may be well known and oft quoted, or they may be obscure.

During the Summer I visited Chichester Cathedral. As I was walking around taking in the beautiful architecture and the sense of God that was in that place, a voice over the loudspeaker asked everyone to stop for a moment to pray. One of the prayers used was written by a former Bishop of Chichester, St Richard:

*Thanks be to Thee, my Lord Jesus Christ
For all the benefits Thou hast given me,
For all the pains and insults Thou hast borne for me.
O most merciful Redeemer, friend and brother,
May I know Thee more clearly,
Love Thee more dearly,
And follow Thee more nearly.*

I love the reference to our Lord Jesus as friend and brother, as it reminds me of the close relationship we have with Him. It also seemed that the three things that are asked for, encapsulate what it is that I would ask of our Lord for myself.

So, back to St Thomas's 80th anniversary; we are doing many things to celebrate this wonderful time and one is to collate a book of 80 prayers put forward by those connected to St Thomas's. These may be prayers written by people themselves or they may be prayers like those above written by Saints or theological writers. We will then be collating the 80 prayers and the reasons they are special to the individuals into a little booklet which will be sold as part of our 80th anniversary celebrations.

Songs of Praise is on BBC1 every Sunday at various times
Sung Compline is available on the app. Tuneln Radio. Type in the search Compline and the most recent service will appear. This **wonderful service comes from St Mark's Episcopal Cathedral in Seattle USA.** It was started in 1956 by Peter R Hallock, who heard the service at Canterbury Cathedral, and on his return to **St Mark's instituted the service of Sung Compline. The choir** have also made many recordings, including the Great O Antiphons of Advent. Their website is www.complinechoir.org
Daily Mass Reading Commentary on Video. This is available through the app. Igod, or the website www.Igod
You can find daily prayers at Universalis
Daily service is on Radio 4 longwave Monday to Friday at 9.45am. If you cannot get Radio 4 longwave on your radio, then go to the app. Tuneln Radio, and type in search Radio 4 198.

HANWELL FRIENDS OF SABASTIYA (WEST BANK PALESTINE) – A FRIENDSHIP GROUP WHICH DOES WHAT IT SAYS ON THE TIN.

This friendship group has been in existence for nearly 4 years now and continues to be very active. We are one of nearly 30 members of the Britain Palestine Twinning Network - each of these groups having links with a particular town or village in the West Bank or Gaza.

We are what we say on the tin! – a people-to-people link which aims to foster friendship between the communities. As with all friends, we get to know each other, care about what is happening, look out for each other and give support when we can.

Tourism

We have an annual visit to Sabastiya, a community of about 3000 people, which lies in the northern W Bank , usually in April/May. We are planning the one for 2014 so if you would like more information please get in touch with us. We realise there are ample opportunities to visit The Holy Land – if you come with us you will be sure to meet ordinary Palestinians – not always the case on some trips where big coaches whisk you round from one **“tourist spot” to another. It is important to hear about their lives and see** for yourself. We usually spend a couple of days in Jerusalem and Bethlehem as well as Sabastiya – which is not so far from Nazareth! Nearby on the outskirts of Jenin is one of the oldest Christian churches in existence. A real gem.

Fundraising

This year our fundraising efforts have gone towards supporting the opening of a new guest house in the village. It is run by the community including many women. The site for the guest house is in a beautiful 300 year old Ottoman palace. Tourism and visits by foreigners to Palestine is vital to the economy - running the Sabastiya guest house gives employment opportunities to villagers in all kinds of ways. For many Palestinians it is often extremely difficult to leave Palestine to work, study or visit relatives – **so visits by people like us “is like oxygen to the lungs” as some Palestinians** put it. It can be easy to feel forgotten and that no one cares.

We try and focus on sustainable projects like the guest house - and planting olive and fruit trees – but in early autumn we readily responded to the request to fund some 50 Ramadan parcels for poor families. We give our friends presents at Christmas.. so after some discussion we thought: why not!

Support from Brentford Football club: this is an exciting development and we hope to work with the Hounslow-Ramallah twinning group in developing football links – players and coaches.

Our yearly meeting

We hope you will feel like coming to our annual meeting to find out more: **it will be in St Thomas' Hall on Saturday 18 January 3 to 6pm** - to include a short film about Sabastiya, light refreshments and a taste of Palestine. Membership is only £5 a year – you will get details of our activities via the mailing list.


