**All Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all
holiness; grant that by the power of your

cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them,
saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood
of the new covenant, which is shed for you
and for many for the forgiveness of sins.
