From our Vicar

Dear Friends

Five weeks into the year and we're marking the end of a season; the Epiphany. For most of us Epiphany came and went on 6th January, but for many in the church the season does not end until 2nd February at the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple or Candlemas as it is more commonly known.

The reason that the season does not end until then is because each Sunday **up to and including that day includes an 'epiphany'.**

Epiphany means to show or reveal, and each Sunday shows, or reveals, something about Jesus. On the Feast of the Epiphany Jesus appears, or is revealed to the three wise men, and then he appears at the River Jordan at his baptism along with the Father and the Holy Spirit, and finally he appears in the Temple at his Presentation forty days after his birth, and is revealed as the light to lighten the world.

All these epiphanies show something divine about Jesus, which is why it is sometimes referred to as *Theophany* instead of *Epiphany* in the Eastern Church. Theophany means the appearing of God, and again this tells us something profound.

If we think about the readings from these Sundays we see God appearing at a baptism, a wedding when the wine runs out, when calling fishermen as disciples and as a baby in the arms of two elderly people. Thus, this is a God who appears, is present in the everyday; extraordinary within the ordinary. I, like the rest of the country, am still reeling from the events in 2016 and worrying about everything from a Hotelier as President (I only know of two Hoteliers; César Ritz and Basil Fawlty) and how our beloved NHS will cope, not to mention Brexit, refugees and so on. These extraordinary events affect very ordinary lives, so perhaps it is good to pause and think about the extraordinary within the ordinary.

This season we are just finishing tells us the amazing story of a God, philosophically the most extraordinary thing of all, touching very ordinary lives, and transforming them. Of all these wonderful stories of ordinary lives transformed it is the one at the end which never fails to move me. The Candlemas account when an elderly priest, Simeon, and elderly prophetess, Anna gaze into the eyes of a baby and see the divine. In their great age they had not become cynical, but, we are told, eagerly awaited the Messiah. They never lost that and were open enough to see it when it came in a surprising form. From their regular place in the temple in Jerusalem they would have seen their fair share of the great and the good, but God appeared as a 40 day old child.

My prayer for us is that in the midst of the noise of extraordinary events, we do not lose our hope that within the ordinary there dwells the divine. May you have an *ordinarily* divine February and 2017.

The Architect refers to, *'The church is much as Maufe left it, and is cherished for its beauty and interest...we included numerous photographs... Tomorrow Project convey to the reader... the extraordinary quality of the ensemble.'* We have a great legacy and responsibility so that future generations will continue to catch a glimpse of the divine within, and through, these walls.

On the more, 'obliviously', devotional side we are hosting the Churches Together in Hanwell Prayer meeting on 4th February at 10am, and Ash Wednesday is on 1st March so please remember to bring in last year's Palm Crosses to burn for the ashes.

Twiddle Muffs

Last summer I went to the Brentford festival, where I unexpectedly met a woman I used to work with. She had a display stall about twiddle muffs. I had heard of these but never seen one.

They are knitted sleeves for dementia patients to fiddle with. They have different textures and colours in them on the outside, and inside they have firmly attached buttons and ribbons.

My friend volunteers at Hanwell House where she said they only had one muff and lots in need. Each muff has only one owner as patients get very attached to their muff, in fact they have a ribbon loop on them so they can **go around the owner’s wrist so it does not get dropped or lost.**

She asked me to make her some. She said 50 would be a good number - I said 5 was a better number! So, armed with left-over balls of wool I got started. It turned out to be quite fun. I have been trying different patterns, putting in secret pockets, and mixing fluffy wool with thin wool, knitting in large beads, and doing cables and bobbles. So addicted to this after finishing my first one I quickly started a second and at a guide activity weekend I took my knitting and sat at the edge of the activities like a Tricoteuse at the foot of the guillotine. Many of the girls, while waiting for their go, came and chatted about my knitting, and one of the guiders asked if I could knit her one (or more) as she worked in a care home in Bedfont.

I am about to start my fourth twiddle muff but have run out of wool. Almost any wool will be suitable and any amount even just a few yards as when you run out of one colour you just tie on the next bit. I would like to place a box at the back of the church to collect any odd balls of wool, and if anyone else wants to knit a twiddle muff they can help themselves to the wool. Patterns are easily found on the internet. And completed twiddle muffins can be left in the church to be passed on to Hanwell house and other care homes or individuals.

Visiting only takes a couple of hours or so and the co-ordinators at VLS are very supportive if one needs advice/help. There is also training and a social side to meet other volunteers....during the year.

I know you will find it worthwhile if you take the plunge.
