



From our Vicar
Dear Friends

A few years ago a NASA Scientist declared that, 'All the atoms on earth and in our bodies were stardust before the solar system formed.' We could also legitimately add that to stardust we will return. That observation seems wonderfully appropriate at this time of year.

During the Ash Wednesday Service I make the sign of the cross on the foreheads of those who attend and say, 'Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return'. That profound symbol of repentance has at its heart a sense of connectedness. The ash on the foreheads becomes a reminder of our common heritage and our common condition. We all share the reality of sometimes falling short of what our shared faith requires.

After saying, 'Remember you are dust...' I go on to say, 'Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ'. The road to repentance, to turning back to God, begins with that acknowledgement of shared humanity and fallenness. This image of sin as a movement away from God by words and actions has its roots in ancient times, and describes a shared sense of departure, loss and rebellion as one turns from the source of love and life. Oscar Wilde, reflecting on his own fall from grace in *De Profundis*, said, 'for in life as in art the mood of rebellion closes up the channels of the soul, and shuts out the airs of heaven'.

If that was all there was to it, a shared sense of loss and departure, then Ash Wednesday, and Lent, becomes no more than a corporate act of spiritual grief. However, this season is one of hope as it not only reminds us of our communal short-comings, but more significantly tells us of our universal confidence. That confidence accompanies us who walk the way of the cross this season, and do so all the way to the foot of that cross. As we gaze at the crucified Christ we do not look at another unjust death in a cruel world, but instead at the emblem and source which says that sin and death do not have the last word.

So although sin and death are shared human conditions, like the very stardust from which we come, so too is the universal solution, Jesus Christ. So this season as we rightly examine ourselves in light of the cross, let us also examine what lies beyond the cross, an empty tomb, and conquered sin and death.

JOAN'S SPEECH TO THE INQUISITOR




From the Editors

The Tots Group

The Tots Group is thriving, we are getting new parents/carers and their children joining regularly. It is common for us to have 30+ adults and 30+ children present at a session. The adults are very friendly and the children delightful. The age range of the children goes from babies to pre school age. Everyone seems to enjoy themselves, which is lovely to see. It is a true community group as we welcome people of all faiths as well as those who have no faith at all.

The Tots Group meets each Wednesday during school term times, between 10.30 and 11.45 a.m. The sessions are held in the Church Hall. Entrance to the sessions is through the Lounge door. There is no charge for attendance at the sessions, as the PCC very kindly covers the hall rental costs for us. The volunteer helpers don't have to organise play activities as the children move freely at will around everything. The parents/carers are responsible for their own children, so volunteers are able to circulate to talk to the adults and the children.

Just before 11.30 the parents and children help us move all the equipment to a corner of the Hall so that we can set chairs out ready for a short singing session. Father Robert leads this, playing his guitar. We sing action songs, then the children choose animal hand puppets and toys ready for use as we sing 'Old MacDonald'. We end up by singing 'Happy Birthday' to anyone who has just had a birthday. Then Father Robert says a very short and simple prayer before we finish the session, tidy things away and clean up.

We really could do with some more volunteer helpers on a regular or more casual basis as often one or more of us can't be there. Sometimes there have only been a couple of volunteers available. I have been the only volunteer there on several occasions, which is quite challenging!.

Therefore if you think that you might be interested in helping, one of the following options could be the one for you:

- between 9.00 and 10.30 helping to sweep the hall and lounge floors; put out chairs and tables; get the play equipment out and get the refreshments ready
- during the actual session, between 10.30 and 11.30, welcome the
 parents, carers and children, particularly any who are there for the first
 time; talk to them; interact with the children in their play if you wish to;
 check that everyone who would like one has got a drink of tea or coffee

and collect up cups, saucers etc which are finished with so that they can be swilled out and then put into the dishwasher

- between 11.30 and about 12.20 help to clear things away, tidy the kitchen, finish filling the dishwasher, sweep the floors and help to put the equipment away again in its storage area
- · provide us with help on one or two Wednesdays a month
- be an 'emergency cover' able to offer to come in and help when we know that we will be short of helpers at a particular session

If you are interested but would like to know a little more about it first please speak to either Rose Noel or myself after church on a Sunday morning, or you can phone me on 8840 0038 to discuss it. If you would prefer it please come along to see for yourself what goes on at a session.

You don't have to 'hi-jack' someone else's child to accompany you in order to do that! We would be very pleased to see you and answer any of your questions. We would be delighted to welcome some new volunteers and trust that they would enjoy it as much as we do!




